INTRODUCTION

WHAT IS A UNIFORM CRIME REPORT?

The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program was implemented in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police to ensure uniformity among law enforcement agencies when reporting crimes to the Federal Government. Statistics are gathered from participating states on eight index crimes.

UCR CRIME CATEGORIES ARE:

- MURDER
- RAPE
- ROBBERY
- AGGRAVATED ASSAULT
- BURGLARY
- THEFT
- AUTO THEFT
- ARSON

With the exception of murder, attempted crimes are included in crime totals. Attempted murder is counted as an Aggravated Assault.



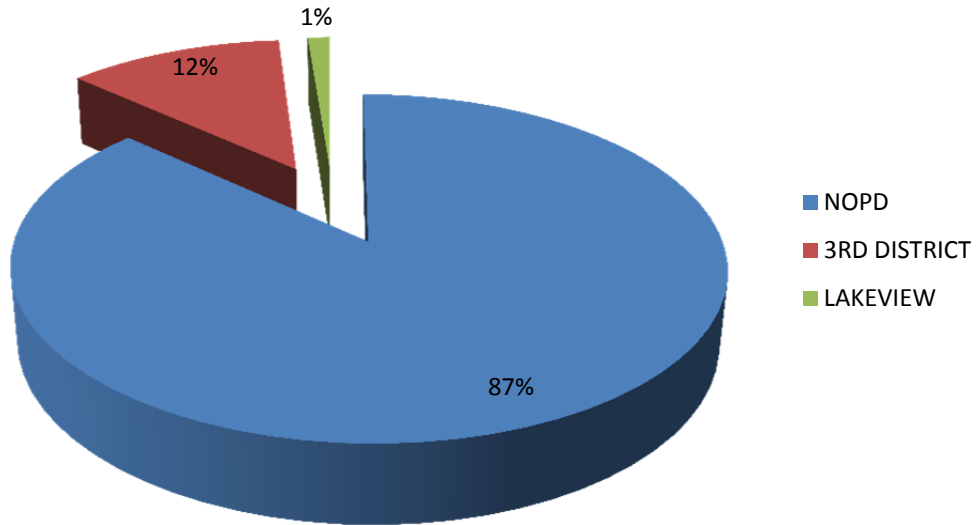

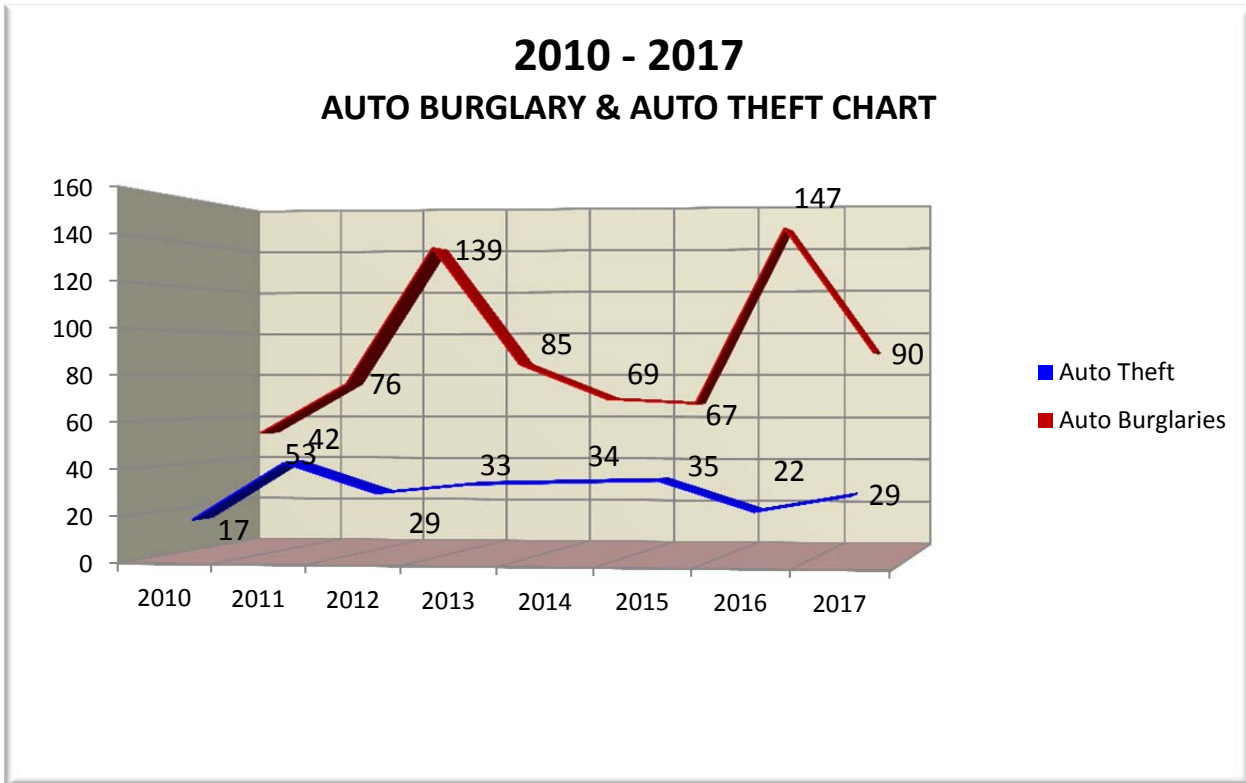

AUTO BURGLARY and AUTO THEFT:

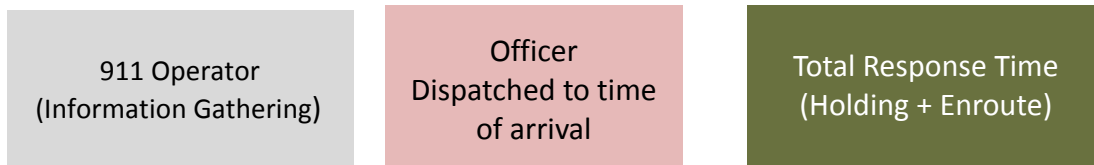
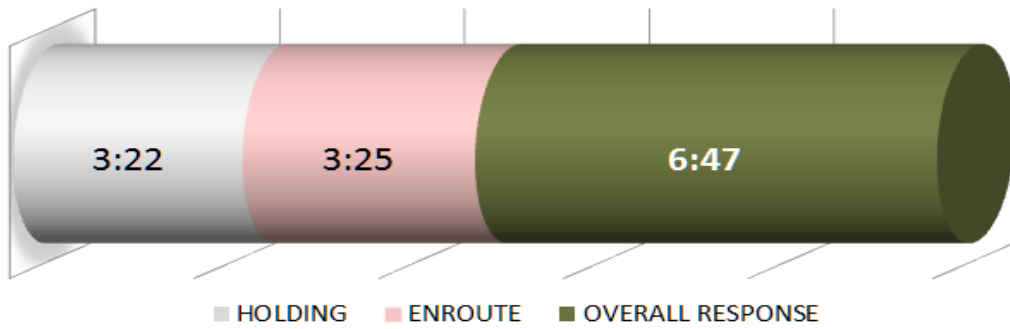


- **90 Auto Burglaries Reported**
 - Forced entry used in only seven (7) incidents.
 - 93% of victims' vehicles were unlocked when the crimes occurred.
 - Seventeen (17) incidents were cleared by arrest (19%).
 - NOPD Auto Burglary Year to Date clearance rate is 06%.
- **29 Auto Thefts Reported**
 - 28 cars and 1 motorcycle reported stolen.
 - 28 unlocked vehicles were stolen with keys or key fobs.
 - 25 vehicles recovered and returned to owners.
 - 08 incidents were cleared by arrest (28%).
 - NOPD Auto Theft year to date clearance rate is 07%.

LCPD JULY 2017 EMERGENCY CALL RESPONSE TIME PROCESS



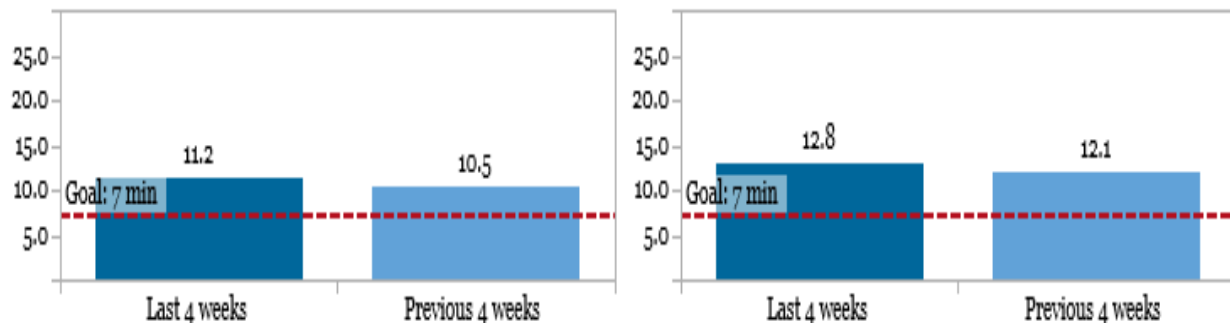
NOTE: July holding time slightly higher than previous months; however officers in route time just over three minutes.

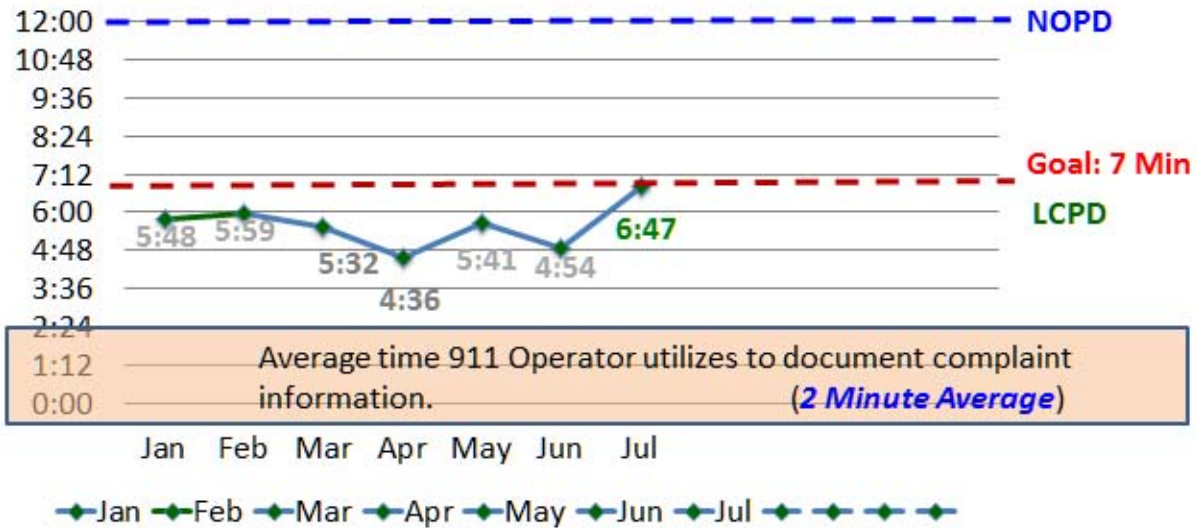

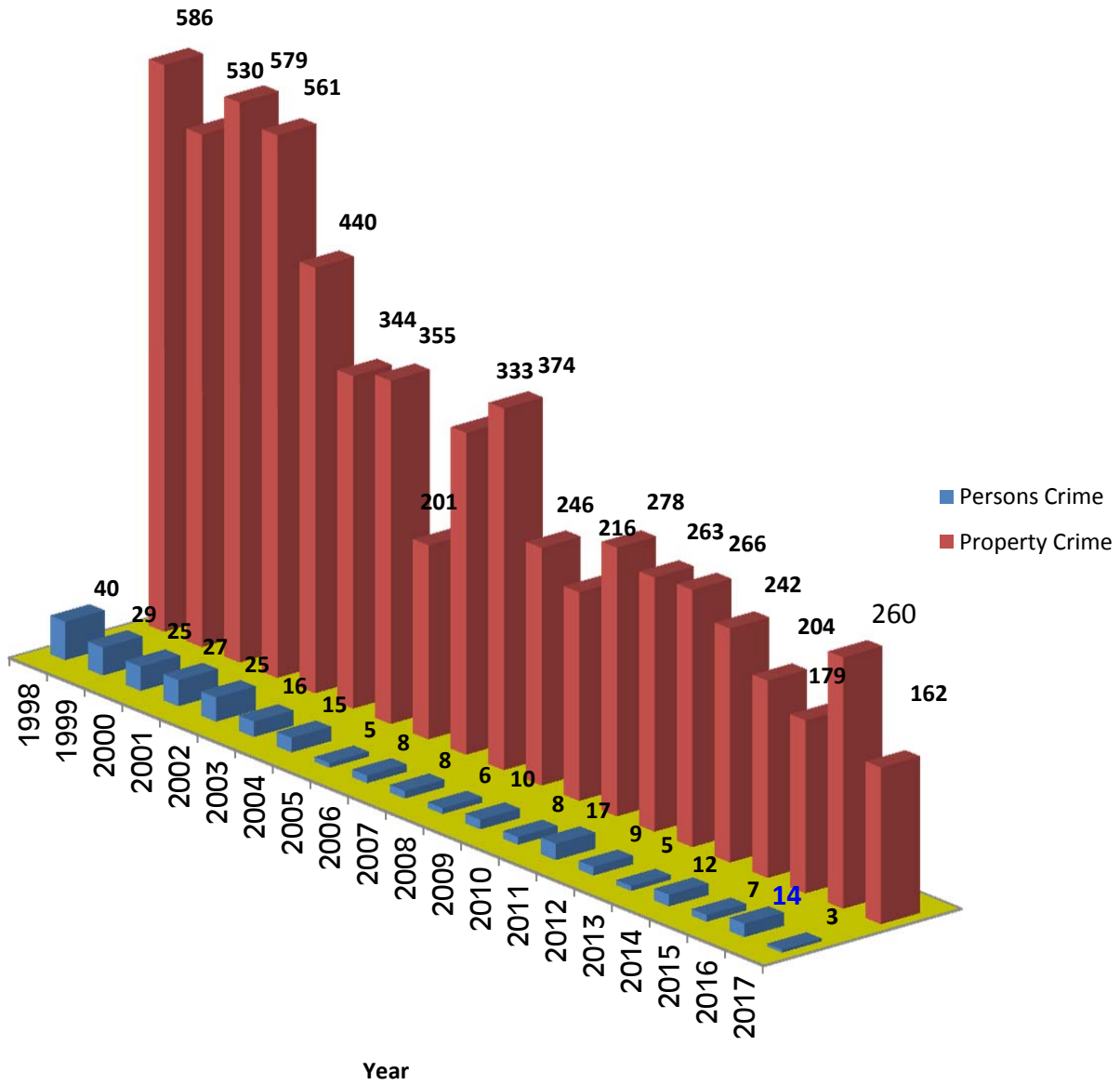

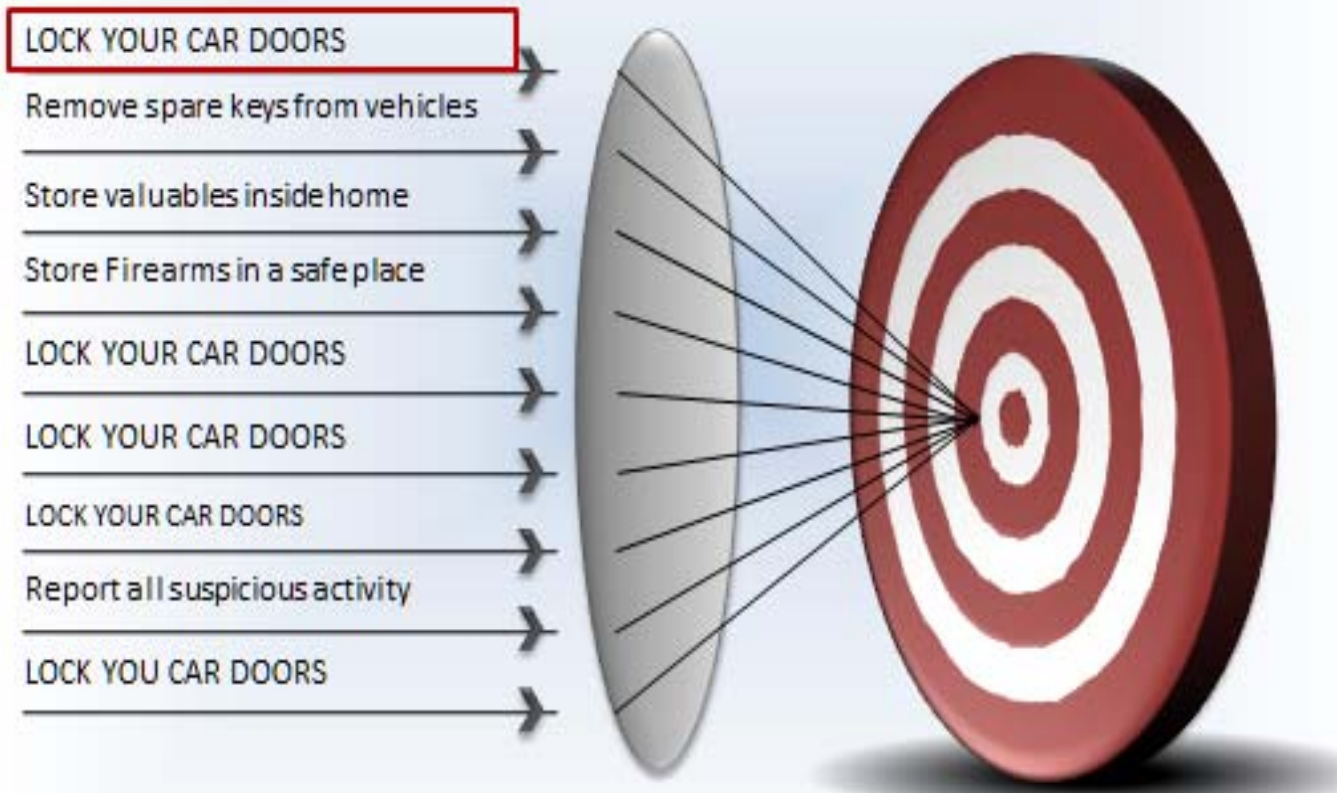

QUALITY OF LIFE ISSUES:

DIAL 311 for QOL Matters.

Quality of Life complaints involving City or State Agencies should be directed to 311. Once the complaint is called in to 311, a work order number is generated and issued to the caller. The complaints are redirected to the respective city agency to be investigated. Citizens can call 311 and give the operator that work order number, to track the progress of the complaint.

Types of QOL complaints which should be called in to 311:

- Oversized Vehicles
- Abandoned Boats
- Abandoned or Illegally Parked Vehicles
- Trash Complaints
- Illegal Dumping
- Wild Animals / Barking Dogs
- Street Signage Complaint
- Blight/ Overgrown Lots

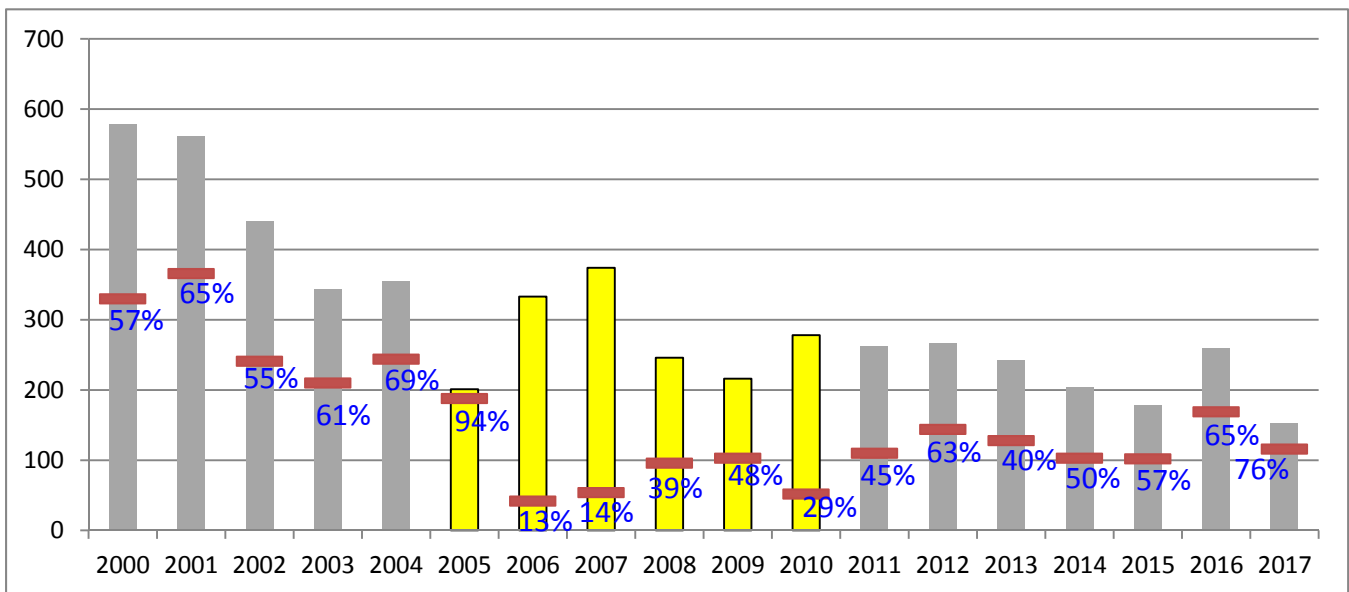

LCPD COMMENTARY:

An overwhelming number of property crimes that occur in Lakeview involve unsecured or unlocked vehicles, which is the primary reason criminals come to Lakeview and commit crimes. Unlocked vehicles have been preferred targets for over two decades due to resident’s history of not locking vehicles.

Due to social media, law enforcement is now able to provide real-time crime data to the communities. Social media posts have sparked healthy dialogue among residents amid crime concerns and how to address them. In a few “Nextdoor” posts, residents once referred to Lakeview as “Mayberry,” which references a town with no crime. Although violent crimes were and are historically low in Lakeview, property crimes have always been a significant concern. It’s just that nowadays; social media information is shared with more households than ever before and crime issues are more to the forefront than it has been in decades.

Case in point, the chart below references total property crimes compared to crimes involving vehicles reported 2000 to 2017. As indicated, stolen vehicles and auto burglaries combined averaged more than half of all property crimes reported in Lakeview, except for the Katrina recovery years (2005-2010).

Many of these crimes could have been prevented by simply locking vehicle doors.

Some argue the point of it being their right and choice to leave vehicle doors unlocked to save money on insurance deductibles in the event car windows are broken during auto burglaries. Criminals will break car windows if valuables are left in plain view however, if you take a minute to properly store valued property and lock your car doors, you've just increased your chances of not becoming a victim.

Right vs. Duty:

As a citizen, it's your right to leave your vehicle(s) unlocked if you choose to do so however, in the interest of safeguarding your community, it's your duty not too.

Please lock your car doors and help prevent crime in your neighborhood.

Any crime is too many and fighting crime takes a community effort.
