

## Lakeview Crime Prevention District Meeting

April 26, 2018

Time: 6:00 p.m.

Location: St Dominic Rectory Meeting Room

Brian Anderson called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. Roll was called. In attendance were: Reid Raymond, Jeb Bruneau, Brian Anderson, Freddy Yoder, Nancy Lytle, Val Cupit, Rory Bellina. A quorum was established with seven members attending. (Martin Landrieu and Michelle Douglas arrived during Sgt. Benjamin's crime report). Brian announced that LCPD attorney Richard Bordelon and LCPD accountant Larry Jacobi were present and that Ann Leblanc would not be able to attend the meeting. There were also approximately five to seven members of the public in attendance at the meeting as well.

**Approval of minutes:** Brian Anderson called for a motion to approve the minutes of the March 22, 2018 board meeting minutes. The motion to approve those minutes was made by Freddy Yoder. It was seconded by Reid Raymond. The motion carried with all in favor and no opposing votes.

### **Public Interest Agenda:**

**Crime Prevention Report & Statistics:** Sgt. Benjamin reviewed the Crime Prevention Report (attached). He covered the month-to-date crime stats in Lakeview for the current month and reviewed several crimes of high public interest, including an aggravated assault where a shot was fired, and a carjacking. Sgt. Benjamin also reviewed a case of shoplifting where a suspect was arrested.

**Financial Report:** Larry Jacobi reviewed the monthly financial statements (attached). He reported that almost six hundred thousand dollars had been collected from the city last month and that everything is within budget and he pointed out that Sgt. Benjamin is going a great job at keeping costs within that budget.

### **Technology Report:**

Brian Anderson passed out the board members a packet of his crime camera presentation and another packet with budget information of the Technology budget (crime camera). Brian Anderson reviewed a slide presentation on the overhead screen about the current status of the crime camera program. He also demonstrated a text alert system to the board members on their smart phones by sending them a sample text. Brian Anderson asked the board for approval to make the LCPD cameras footage available to the city's monitoring center. The motion to do so was made by Martin Landrieu and was seconded by Jeb Bruneau. The motion was clarified as being for the board to allow LCPD to send footage from their cameras to the New Orleans Real-Time Crime Center at a cost not to exceed one hundred forty-four dollars per camera per year in a manner that would comply with all laws and that counsel would be consulted in order to assure compliance. A vote was held, and the motion passed with all in favor and none opposed.

Michelle Douglas then made a motion to approve the SMS alert system and asked that a protocol be defined to establish a process to determine who is sending out the SMS notices and for what reason (s) and that the SMS system is budgeted at fifteen hundred dollars per year. The motion was seconded by Nancy Lytle. A vote was held, and the motion passed with all in favor and none opposed.

Brian Anderson announced that he would hold a Technology Committee meeting within the next month. He reminded the board members that financial disclosure forms were due in to the ethics board by May 15<sup>th</sup>. He committed to sending the board members their appointment letters because the dates may be needed in order to complet

e the disclosure form. He also reminded the board members that they must complete the online ethics course before the end of the calendar year. Michelle Douglas said that she would send out the link to that course to the board members.

Freddy Yoder commented that he never envisioned the LCPD reaching the level of sophistication and loyalty when the LCPD was created many years back. He pointed out the many people putting many hours above and beyond way their positions on the board require and he thanked them all for their efforts.

There were no other additional public comments and Brian Anderson called for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Freddy Yoder, it was seconded by Jeb Bruneau a vote was held and there were none opposed. The meeting was adjourned and approximately 7:30PM.
